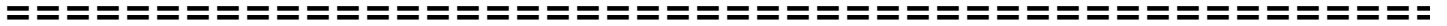


# How To Stop Sprint Collections



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The best way to Lose Cash With How To Stop Debt Collectors  
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Yes, your dentist, doctor, or hospital can send the unpaid balance on your account to collections at any time. Yes, they can. There is no legal requirement that forces a collection agency to accept any offer. That mini-miranda lets you know that it is an attempt to collect the debt and if you dispute any portion of the debt, then please notify the collection agency. Inform the skip tracer in writing (using the address info you obtained in the previous step) you either refuse to pay your debt, if that is truly the case, or that you wish the debt collector to "cease further communication" with you. You should never ignore this notice -- especially if the debt collector has your valid address or perhaps

even your employment. What happens over days, months, even years if you don't pay your credit cards? Demand your social security number, credit or debit card number, or bank account number.

Avoid having your account sent to collections by following through. A validation of debt letter should always be sent with proof of delivery. Generally, a first notice will be sent by the bill collector advising you of their purchase or assignment of the debt. Consumer debt hit \$14.3 trillion during the first quarter, right as the pandemic began to unfold in the U.S, according to the New York Federal Reserve. Code § 28-3814 to add a number of temporary restrictions related to the collection of consumer debt during the coronavirus pandemic. Learning that you have debts in collection can add a lot of stress and anxiety to your life. All collection phone calls, whether for yourself or for someone else, can be stopped, however. Another telltale sign is when a consumer answers the phone and there is nobody on the other end, or it takes a few seconds before someone answers. A phone call will not preserve your rights. If you have got bad credit, you will feel the voyage is hopeless. A "debt" is any monetary obligation enforceable by law including credit, loans of money, or provisions of goods and services.

They cannot talk about your debt to other people (including your neighbors, friends, relatives, or employer). The regulations also require debt collectors to notify debtors of their right to dispute the debt, and whether the statute of limitations has expired. Before you consider paying the debt, know that you have a right to request that the bill collector provide adequate proof of the (alleged) debt. While its not barred in all states to collect on an expired debt, it is an absolute defense -- BUT, you need to assert that defense to stop collections. Many people will pay a collection account and risk renewing the statute of limitations only to find after that it is too late and that they had an absolute defense to the a debt. Expert's would never recommend paying any debt prior to validating it. In that case you would clearly know the debt is legitimate and perhaps you'd want to settle it. 5. Know your legal

rights.

If you have been contacted by a debt collector then you should know that you have a right to dispute the validity of the debt. Investigate bankruptcy. Know the pros and cons of chapters 7 & 13 if you owe more than you can possibly pay. After the debt collector receives the letter, the agency may call you only once more -- to notify you it will not be calling again. Call or write to the collection agency and explain that you are unable to pay the requested amount. Having a minimum payment standard is unworkable when each patient owes a different amount. What are the minimum monthly payment on hospital and other medical bills? Can a medical debt collector refuse a payment plan? If the debt cannot be verified, it cannot remain on your credit either. If the debt has been assigned to a collector with no records then the VOD will stop them in their tracks and remove the item from your credit reports. On the other hand, to ensure the privacy of consumer debtors is still protected, there is also the Fair Debt Collection Practices Act (FDCPA).

Any office that conducts direct debt collection in Maine must have an individual license. And what that function is say we have somebody, John Smith we can't find, we can pay a monthly service and any account that we're on their bureau for, the hundreds of thousands of people, if they suddenly surface or they get a new address or a new phone number, we get an email alert. They laugh when it rings and they get to hear me, once again, trying to get the debt collectors off my back. Debt collectors must not only tell you who they are and how you can reach them, but they must tell you how much you owe. But the credit bureau is so much more important now than it was 20 years ago. Showing effort to either settle the debt or take on a payment plan can potentially help you get a more reasonable repayment

solution. Blair Demarco-Wettlaufer: Yes, that application will update the bureau and determine whether you get a credit card. Blair Demarco-Wettlaufer: Exactly, and it's publically available. And it's tragic, but the 70% of the people we don't find obviously we mail a letter, we try calling, the number's not in service, we can't get a hold of them, we upload that to the credit bureau because we have no other way to reach them.

And more people - in the last three, four years, cell phone companies have started reporting as trade line items to the credit bureau. Debt collectors are paid based on how much they bring in each month, so you are more likely to get a good deal if you wait until the end of the month. So, now there's even more data available than there was before. So, it could be that I've been off the radar for three or four years, I've now come back; maybe I was out of the province, the country or whatever. Or, I can give my staff access to individually pull full bureaus and it'll show the last three addresses, place of employment, whether they pay their bills on time, who's inquired about them, we can get a full bureau and that's a few dollars. Debt collectors cannot give you false or misleading information, or apply unreasonable pressure on you to pay off your debts. Blair Demarco-Wettlaufer: Ahh! And that's where I was going, so I can pull a credit bureau scrub, so the 15,000 accounts, I can go in and say give me their addresses and phone numbers.

Because that's our only recourse at that moment, we haven't had the chance to negotiate with the person before listing it on the bureau. I was working in the office and this person in Alberta called into our office, I found this on my credit bureau, oh my god, how do I take care of this? In this day and age, it costs, in Ontario it's easy to take somebody to court but it costs about 400 or \$500 to take something to garnishment. At Cobalt Credit Services, we take Credit Repair seriously. Blair Demarco-Wettlaufer: Yes. A lot of the bigger agencies - obviously the credit bureau is a service. Blair Demarco-Wettlaufer: And you signed off at the bottom consent for them to share that data, absolutely. But if you go into that, you can look up

people in the U.S and it gathers census data, social media data, Google street view data and literally you can type in John Harrison. And it's all hypothetical at this point, but it's entirely possible that down the road, in five or ten years, your credit score will be determined by how long you've had your Facebook account because it's really hard to invent a social media identity and keep it going over years and years and years.

And there are a bunch of radicals now talking about building a credit score based on a social media footprint. When there are multiple children the parents sometimes want the home sold immediately and all the money split between the children equally. There is also loophole with time-barred debts. It does this at less face value and makes its money when it collects the face value of the debts. John Harrison lives in Michigan, you pull up all the John Harrison's in Michigan, you pick the one in Dearborn, you click on it, and it shows you a Google street view of his house, the average market value of the houses in that area. I'll be honest, we probably only find on average 30 to 40% of the people listed in our office. If you apply for a bank account, a new apartment, a job in some cases, people are pulling your credit data. According to the Better Business Bureau, there are several things people should do when contacted by a debt collector. Well I can tell you that there are many debt collectors who aren't harassing people because business is business.
