Subject and predicate worksheets for grade 6 with answers

About this Worksheet: This subject and predicate worksheet directs the student to underline the simple subject and simple predicate in each given sentence. The simple subject is what the sentence is talking about. It is part of the complete subject. The simple predicate is the main word or phrase that tells something about the subject of the sentence. This worksheet is suitable for 1st grade, 2nd grade, 3rd grade, 4th grade, 5th grade, 6th grade, 7th grade and 8th grade. Subjects and predicates (or nouns and verbs) are the main components of English sentences. They comprise the most essential information of every sentence. Every sentence has two main parts: a complete subject and a complete predicate. The complete subject includes all words that tell who or what the subject is. Example: Most birds | can fly. The complete predicate includes all words that state the action or condition of the subject. Example: Most birds | can fly. Although these sentences lack the adjectives, adverbs, conjunctions, et cetera that we are used to (and that give sentences more flavor), they still provide the basic function of conveying pertinent information. Below you'll find our list of printable subjects and predicates worksheets. In addition, worksheets on related topics, such as sentence fragments, commands and questions, and inverted sentences have been provided. Each worksheet provides explanations, examples, and practice manipulating both subject and predicate. A Subject and Predicate is used to form a complete sentence. A subject is who or what the sentence is about. The predicate is the action the subject does in a sentence. The predicate always begins with a verb. You cannot write a complete sentence if you leave out a subject or predicate. Both the subject and and predicate are needed to express a complete thought. A sentence that is missing either a subject or predicate is called a sentence fragment. Most students struggle at an early age writing sentences with both a subject and predicate. We usually use these words in a group in correct order. The cat sat on the mat. A group of words which makes complete sense, is called a sentence. Thus a sentence is a group of words that are kept in a particular order to make a complete sense. 2. Sentences are of four kinds: Those which make statements or assertions; as: Humpty Dumpty sat on a wall. This is called a Declarative or Assertive sentence. Those which ask questions; as: What is your name? This is called an Interrogative sentence. Those which express commands, requests or entreaties; as: Be quiet. Have mercy on me. This is called an Imperative sentence. Those which express strong feelings, as: How warm the day is! What a shameful behaviour! This is called an Exclamatory sentence. 3. Every sentence has two parts! (i) Subject and (ii) Predicate When we make a sentence - (i) We name some person or thing. (ii) Say something about that person or thing. In other words, we must have a subject to speak about and we must say or predicate something about that subject. (a) So, the part which names the person or thing we are speaking about is called the Subject of the sentence. (b) The part which tells something about the subject is called the Predicate of the sentence. For example: Subject Predicate Suresh runs Birds fly Girls play My brother passed the examination It is very cold today The dogs bark at night. Copyright © 2021 K5 Learning A sentence can be considered to have two parts: a subject and a predicate. The subject is what the sentence is about; the predicate tells us what the subject is or does. The predicate is the part of the sentence containing a verb and not including the subject. In these worksheets, students identify the subjects and predicates in sentences.
