Milwaukee emissions test

MADISON, Wis. - The Wisconsin Vehicle Inspection Program (WVIP) announced on Monday, Sept. 30 a new vehicle emission testing program. It features kiosks which motorists can use to conduct the testing themselves. A news release says the two self-service kiosks have been installed at the new test-only facilities located at 8718 W. Brown Deer Road in Milwaukee and 9300 S. 27th Street in Oak Creek. Vehicles with a model year of 2007 and newer will be able to test at the WVIP Self-Service Kiosks. Officials said the launch of self-service kiosks is part of a larger initiative from the Wisconsin Vehicle Inspection Program to expand emission testing services throughout the seven-county southeast Wisconsin region. SIGN UP TODAY: Get daily headlines, breaking news emails from FOX6 News Nearly 200 emission test locations are now open across the seven-county area, including test-only facilities located on 27th Street and Brown Deer roads. These test-only facilities are dedicated to performing inspections on demand. Motorists are encouraged to visit the site and queue up for service without needing an appointment. These locations also provide registration renewal services. Emissions inspections remain free to motorists. Technical Assistance Centers remain in place to assist motorists in diagnosing vehicles that have difficulty passing inspections and achieving compliance. WisconsinTransportationNews New rules for EPA carbon emission, EV requirementsThe federal government is unveiling rules that relax requirements for electric vehicles and car emissions.If you're due to get your vehicle tested for pollutant emissions, the process is now a bit easier in the Milwaukee area: the state's Department of Transportation just installed two self-service kiosks for vehicle emission testing.Though more than a dozen emission testing sites already exist in the greater Milwaukee area, the new kiosks will provide especially flexible hours and speedy service.Here's what to know about vehicle emission testing requirements in Milwaukee and how to use the new self service kiosks.The kiosks are at two Wisconsin Vehicle Inspection Program (WVIP) sites: 8718 W. Brown Deer Road in Brown Deer and 9300 S. 27th St. in Oak Creek.Both kiosks are open 24/7, though the WVIP sites are only open Tuesday through Saturday from 10 a.m. to 6 p.m. You don't need an appointment ahead of time to use a kiosk.Like all emissions tests in Wisconsin, the kiosks are free to use. They can test vehicles with the model year 2007 or newer.You'll need to bring just one of the following documents to your emissions test, according to the WVIP:Vehicle registration renewal statement (either a hard copy sent by mail or an email notice)Your vehicle's certificate of registrationA prior emission inspection reportAn emission letter you received from the Department of Motor VehiclesA Substitute Renewal Notice/Non-operation StatementYour Wisconsin vehicle titleMore: You have less than 8 months to get a Real ID. Here's how to get one in WisconsinIf your vehicle is due for an emission test, WisDOT will send you a notice.You can expect a notice if any of the following apply to you. These requirements apply to vehicles with auto or light truck plates; vehicles with model years between 1996 and 2006 with a gross vehicle weight rating less than 8,501 pounds; and vehicles with model years 2007 and newer with a gross vehicle weight rating up to 14,000 pounds.If you recently purchased a vehicle, a test is required within 45 daysIf an owner is added or removed on a vehicle title, a test is required within 45 daysA test if required every other year before plates can be renewedNew residents transferring vehicle to Wisconsin must get a test within 45 daysGenerally speaking, vehicles that are stored and driven in any of the following southeastern Wisconsin counties will require an emissions test at some point: Milwaukee, Kenosha, Ozaukee, Racine, Sheboygan, Washington and Waukesha.In addition to the kiosks, there are more than a dozen automotive shops and repair centers around Milwaukee where you can get your vehicle emission tested.
