Students applying must submit standardized test scores and should submit test results according to the grade to which they are applying. Registration for these tests is handled through the respective testing agencies. Please note: Late registration charges, which are substantial, are not covered by the fee waiver. It is important to refer to the student guides for the SSAT or ISEE to determine the test dates, times, and sites in your area and to encourage the student to meet the stated deadlines. All financial aid scholarships are awarded through the generosity of alumni, parents, and friends of the Academy and are guaranteed through endowed scholarship funds. Andover uses the Clarity Tuition application to securely collect your financial aid application and supporting tax documents. All applicant families, both international and domestic, with an interest in applying for financial aid should use the Clarity application.It is important that you indicate that you intend to apply for financial aid in the Candidate Profile on the Gateway to Prep Schools website. This alerts us to your interest and allows us to send you financial aid tips and reminders. For us to budget properly, Andover requires all families considering current or future financial assistance apply in their initial application year. There is no disadvantage to applying for financial aid at Andover. Our admission officers do not have access to your financial information and your financial aid status is not considered in the admission process.To adhere to best practices and allow us to offer a comprehensive review of all submissions for financial aid, Andover requires applicants to submit financial information from all living parents. Divorced or separated families should each complete a separate financial aid application. No information will be shared between parties. Single parents need to provide proof of single-parent status. A copy of a birth certificate or a letter from an attorney, clergy person or school counselor with an understanding of your situation should be emailed to . Your financial aid application will not be considered complete until all parts have been submitted.Like the admission application deadline, the financial aid application deadline is February 1. Andover will communicate decisions about financial aid awards on March 10.To get started, please go to the Financial Aid Application and create an account. The application typically takes less than 30 minutes to complete. It is mobile-friendly so you can complete it from anywhere. You are also able to save your progress and return to it at any time.
