Taskmaster series 7 winner

James and Phil lag behind with lower scores. The live task was to make the best fruit display hat without touching the fruit or own hat. Rhod took the lead in this round as well. Episode ranking is topped by Kerry with 20 points, followed by Rhod Gilbert with 19 points. Jessica Knappett takes third place with 14 points. Rhod wins the prize task for the boldest belt with a stuffed goat's head attached to it. Phil also wins with a custom-made belt worth £50. The team task saw James, Phil and Rhod taking the lead in painting the best still life while blindfolded. Jessica and Kerry came in second place. In Task 3, Jessica correctly guessed that her assigned contestant would use the airhorn, earning her 10 points. Everyone else scored 5 points. Kerry wins Task 4 by drawing the biggest and best circle with a large circular shape. Rhod comes in second with 4 points. Given text Jessica and the others traced a circle on a printed map of Europe. Phil tried to gather many circles but was given a point after finding one in the garden brickwork. Kerry made the highest tower within a hoop without leaving it, winning five points. The winner is Kerry with 23 points plus 1 tiebreaker. Episode ranking has Kerry at number one and Jessica at number two. Episode Ranking: Winner: James Acaster (18 points) Kerry Godliman (17 points) Jessica Knappett and Phil Wang (15 points) Rhod Gilbert (9 points). As of Series 14, this is the only episode in which the Taskmaster awarded no points to a prize task entry. Task 1: Work Out What Happens When You Flick This Switch On, Without Taking The Switch Out Of The Room. Winner: James (5 points) Kerry (4 points) Phil (3 points) Jessica (2 points) Rhod - technically Rhod did not work out what happened, but he did argue that nothing happened if you switched off the connector switch underneath the task switch Task 2: Dramatically Alter Your Appearance (In The Time It Takes This Elevator To Go Down One Floor). Winner: James (5 points) Rhod (4 points) Kerry (3 points) Phil (2 points) Jessica (1 point) Live Task: Correctly Don The Most New Items Of Clothing In 100 Seconds While Handcuffed James - (5 points) and Jessica, Kerry and Rhod (4 points) Rhod Gilbert wins the episode with 17 + 1 tiebreaker points, followed by James Acaster with 17 points. Here is a summary of each task: Winner of Worst Present From A Named Relative: - Jessica Knappett (5 points) for her opera gloves and feather boa. - Rhod Gilbert (4 points) for his candle-holder given to him by his wife Sian. - Kerry Godliman (3 points) for her yin-yang dream-catcher earrings. - James Acaster (2 points) for the joke-calendar made for him by his then-five year old nephew. - Phil Wang (1 point) for used toilet paper. Winner of Delivering The Task To The Taskmaster's Assistant: - James (5 points) with a spectacular delivery. - Rhod Gilbert (4 points) threw the task through the door while impaled on a javelin. - Jessica Knappett (3 points) attached the task to a basket and floated it. - Phil Wang (2 points) had someone else deliver the task, adding "Fuck You James Acaster" to it. Winner of Secret Team Task: - James, Jessica, Kerry, and Rhod (5 points each) for making as many white circles on the target from behind the rope. Winner of Cheer Up This Former Traffic Warden: - James and Jessica (5 points each) told the traffic warden to "cheer up". - Phil Wang (3 points) was close but had fewer correct answers. - Rhod Gilbert (2 points). - Kerry Godliman (1 point). Or as big as possible in twenty minutes competition winner was James, Phil, and Rhod (got three points), while Jessica and Kerry got two. Live team task involved each member of the teams having to dangle an item from a hanger within twenty seconds after the last turn; once you touched it, you had to hang it. The first team whose item fell lost. James noted this is similar to "Coathanger Buckaroo". The Taskmaster predicted that Rhod would make a joke about his weight, which he indeed did. In the end, Jessica and Kerry won (got five points), while James, Phil, and Rhod got nothing. This was the first live team task in the episode. The ranking is as follows: Jessica Knappett (25 points) followed by James Acaster (20 points), then Rhod Gilbert (18 points), followed by Kerry Godliman (17 points), and lastly Phil Wang (9 points). Episode 6 - "A Coquettish Fascinator" had a prize task where the best key winner was announced. Kerry won the key to her old camper van, while Jessica got a key lime pie (four points). Rhod's "key" on the graph consisted of embarrassing photos of Taskmaster from episode 3; although he got three points, points were deducted due to him being "gobby". Phil brought the "G" key from a piano but lost some points because Taskmaster doubted he had one. James won with a bowl of ice cream (one point) saying it was the "key to his heart". In task 1a, contestants had to put exactly fifty different items in a bin within time limits. The winner was James, who finished in forty-eight seconds and got five points. Kerry took one minute twenty-seven seconds and won four points, while Rhod took two minutes thirty seconds for three points, Jessica two minutes fifty-two seconds for two points, and Phil took six minutes and fifty-seven seconds and got two points (one of which was a bonus point). The bonus point was awarded because Phil was the only contestant to find fifty literally different items in the bin. Task 1b involved using those items to make the best picture of Taskmaster. James won this task too, by breaking his ukulele apart into multiple pieces to create more materials for his artwork. He got five points and broke the record with his depiction, which would have earned him ten points if allowed. Rhod got four points, Kerry three, Jessica two (she put art supplies in her bin but forgot to use them), and Phil one point. Task 2 was a team task that involved writing and recording the best soap opera cliffhanger. The winner was James, Phil, and Rhod for "Feelings", where Phil had been in the bath for nine months, pregnant and having an affair with Rhod (who's also known as "Rub-A-Dub-Dub"), leaving James downstairs waiting for dinner. Jessica and Kerry got two points for "Cul-De-Sac" where Donna and Donna have been having affairs with the same man who turns out to be Kerry-"Donna"'s son. Looking forward to the next episode of the show, where contestants had to fit all the glasses into one of the boxes without breaking any pair. Phil was declared the winner with 5 points after correctly guessing that it was drinking glasses and managing to fit them into box F despite breaking one glass. Jessica secured second place with 4 points for her correct guess and effort. The live task required contestants to hold hands with their neighbors and get an inflatable donut as high as possible within 100 seconds. Rhod won this round with 5 points after kicking his donut into the audience, while James took third place with 3 points. Kerry was disqualified due to taking the opportunity to put a donut around her head. The prize task involved finding the most exciting thing starting with "G". Although no one secured more than three points in this round, Rhod and James earned two points each for their efforts. The rest of the contestants received one point each for their participation. Blink Wins. Your Time Starts In Ten Seconds All contestants failed to realize they could close their eyes before the timer started and wouldn't need to blink. Winner: Rhod (5 points) Jessica (4 points) James (3 points) Phil (2 points) Kerry (1 point) Task 3: Team Task - Make The Best Extension To The Taskmaster House In Thirty Minutes Winner: Jessica and Kerry (4 points) James (2 points) Sympathy points awarded to James for his team's poor performance. Phil and Rhod (1 point) This is the first (and only) team task with individual scores, although future tasks will have some contestants receive bonus points or work against their teammates. Rhod had a video of the Taskmaster sleeping after hiding in his bedroom closet. James showed a mummified cat from the Kettering Manor House Museum. Task 1: Poke The Least Expected Thing Through The Hole In The Roof Of This Grotto Winner: Rhod - exposed rear end, squirts of water and classical music (5 points) Jessica - set task on fire (4 points) James - underpants with an improvised song (2 points) Kerry - bra (1 point) Phil - jumpsuit (1 point) Locate all tasks and piece together letters to complete instruction — SCREAM. Quickest wins prevail. To prevent guessing ahead of time, last letter S is given first, with instructions to put it at the beginning. Winner: James (5 points), Jessica (4 points), Kerry (3 points), Phil (2 points), Rhod (1 point). Task 3: Compose best 30-second piece of music using this accompanying bandnote with Kieran Towers, George Buzna, and Dan Edwards. Winner: Jessica - "Here I Am, I'm A Violin" (5 points); James and Rhod (4 points), James - "Over My Shoulder", Rhod - "The Ballad of the Toothless Goon". Task 2a: Split task — be photographed in most unusual situation wearing this fez. Winner: Jessica - airliner cockpit with pilot nicknamed "Fez" (3 points); Kerry - photo of herself.. Taskmaster Episode Highlights: The contestants participated in various tasks, showcasing their creativity and skills. In Task 1b, Rhod's attempt to take a photo of the Taskmaster's mother wearing a fez was appreciated by Rhod but deducted points due to not being the actual photographer. In Task 2b, James demonstrated improvement in his studio recording despite initially choking on his attempt. This earned him partial marks. The Sock Task (Task 3) proved challenging as contestants had to identify the sock with a Satsuma without looking inside any of them. Rhod's strategy was criticized by James due to potential bias, and thus no winner was awarded for this task. In Team Task 4, Jessica and Kerry secured points for achieving exactly 24 shots in their rally, earning a bonus point for using ambitious equipment. During the Live Task, participants were required to write their name and draw a picture of a happy horse upside down on a sheet of overhead projector acetate within 100 seconds. James emerged as the winner of this task. Episode rankings saw Kerry Godliman taking the top spot with 21 points, followed by Jessica Knappett (18 points), James Acaster (14 points), Phil Wang (11 points), Rhod Gilbert (9 points). Jessica would likely be nine years old if this survey was conducted now. Rhod's "Holepunch" photo bears a resemblance to an embarrassing Taskmaster photograph from episode 3. For the siren task, Phil won with a time of 1 minute and 14 seconds. Rhod finished second but took too long to tie himself up. Jessica came in third after mistaking the siren for local noise. Kerry elected to complete Task 4 before attempting this one. The winner of Find The Boiled Egg is James with a fast time. Everyone else was disqualified due to breaking the boiled egg or failing to identify it. Rhod's best recreation won Task 3, and he also tied up the Taskmaster's Assistant quickly enough to win Task 4. Kerry outlasted everyone on Live Task: Sausage Or Finger?. James Acaster tops the episode ranking with 19 points, followed by Kerry Godliman (15), Rhod Gilbert (14), Phil Wang (13), and Jessica Knappett (11). The series saw various contestants winning episodes, including the ultimate champion. Until Series 13, it held the record for being the most recent series where at least one contestant didn't win an episode, and it was also unique for having only 10 episodes. Notably, this series is the second where every contestant experienced coming in last at least once. A detailed breakdown of task wins by contestants reveals: Rhod Gilbert secured 18 tasks, including two prize tasks, seven video tasks, and others. James Acaster won 17 tasks across various categories; Kerry Godliman achieved 15 tasks, spanning prize tasks, video tasks, and live tasks; Jessica Knappett won 12 tasks, with a mix of individual and team efforts; and Phil Wang secured nine tasks. In episode 7, no winner was declared for a prize task, as James and Rhod tied with two points each. Similarly, in episode 9, two video tasks had no winners: one due to James not receiving full marks, and the other because the Taskmaster chose not to declare a winner despite Kerry and Rhod being tied. Each episode's title was inspired by quotes from participants or the Taskmaster himself, offering humorous insights into the challenges they faced, such as measuring beans, drawing circles, and attempting to read lips. The titles reflect the whimsical nature of the tasks and the contestants' reactions to them, showcasing the light-hearted and comedic essence of the series. make the best portrait of Taskmaster submission, a "fascinator" described as "a little coquettish." Series 7: James Acaster (rant about Rhod Gilbert's failure to alert teammates about garage supplies for team task): "bad enough he did that, put cardboard on, said 'This is an extension, ' looked at us like 'what the f**k you gonna do about that?' and gone back into the house." Episode 8: Taskmaster (responding to Phil Wang's criticisms of Rhod Gilbert's song length submission): "fair to Rhod, harder narrative to cram into thirty seconds than 'some people play blues and an irritated mother honks her horn". Episode 9: Taskmaster (discussing unfortunate combination of Phil Wang's costume and hula-hooping attempt): "sometimes it doesn't matter how ornate the grandfather clock is, the pendulum draws the eye." Series Ranking Winner: Kerry Godliman (176 points) Jessica Knappett (175 points) Rhod Gilbert (167 points) James Acaster (165 points) Phil Wang (133 points). The challenges are divided into episodes, with tasks ranging from physical obstacles to creative endeavors. In each episode, contestants must complete a series of tasks, with varying levels of difficulty and complexity. Some examples of tasks include:
* Creating the biggest circle in one sweep
* Making as many white circles on a target without stepping beyond a rope
* Delivering a task to Alex in the most spectacular way
* Dangling an item from a hanger in a team setting
Contestants earn points for each completed task, and some episodes have bonus tasks or penalties. The ultimate goal is to win prizes, such as "most confusing thing" or "worst present from a named relative." Throughout the challenges, contestants must think creatively, work together, and push themselves to complete difficult tasks within tight time limits. In each episode, contestants are given various challenges to complete in order to win prizes. The tasks range from creative ones, such as making the best picture or writing a suspenseful soap opera cliff-hanger, to physical ones, like getting their doughnut as high as possible while holding hands with others. Each task has specific rules and constraints, and contestants must work individually or in teams to complete them. Some challenges require minimal effort, such as simply standing still for a certain amount of time, while others demand more creativity and skill. The tasks are divided into three categories: Live, where contestants compete against the clock; Team, where two people work together; and Taskmaster, where one person completes a task with specific rules. The winners receive prizes, which can be anything from small gifts to bigger rewards. Throughout the episodes, there are also bonus challenges that offer additional prizes for those who complete them. The last challenge of each episode is often the most physically demanding, such as improving their hulaing skills or writing their name and drawing a happy horse. The format of the show varies slightly between episodes, but the overall goal remains the same: to have fun and be creative while competing with others for prizes. your overhead projector acetate has to be placed upside down and not rotated or manipulated.
