Flying Mounts in Burning Crusade Classic: A Guide Flying mounts offer a convenient way to travel in Burning Crusade Classic, allowing players to bypass obstacles and reach their destinations quickly. The cost of flying mounts varies depending on the mount's quality and the riding skill level required. However, Druids can fly at level 68 using Flight Form, a new shapeshift that can be trained from class trainers for 8 gold and 60 silver. There are two flying trainers in Burning Crusade Classic: Ilsa Blusterbrew (Wildhammer Stronghold, Shadowmoon Valley) for the Alliance, and Olokk (Shadowmoon Village, Shadowmoon Valley) for the Horde. Additionally, players can purchase flying mounts from Windrider Keepers and Gryphon Keepers next to the trainers. **Flying Mounts** * Alliance Flying Mounts: Golden Gryphon, Tawny Windrider, Ebon Gryphon, Blue Windrider, Snowy Gryphon, Green Windrider Horde Flying Mounts: Swift Blue Gryphon, Swift Red Windrider, Swift Red Gryphon, Swift Green Windrider, Swift Green Gryphon, Swift Yellow Windrider, Swift Purple Gryphon, Swift Purple Windrider Note that there is no discount for faction reputation, and accumulating the 5,000 Gold required for an epic flying mount can be challenging. However, this guide will provide more information on how to acquire flying skills and mounts in Burning Crusade Classic. Flying costs: Expert Riding - 60% speed - 800g. You can get riding at level 20, but expert riding and flying start at level 60. Warlock and Paladin need Expert riding and level 40. Here's how to unlock flying in WoW: First join a covenant then do three things - earn 44 Renown with your Covenant and complete the Covenant Campaign. To get new flying mounts, you must finish The High Keep main quest and San Bakar's Trial main quest. Druids didn't have to buy flying back in TBC; they could learn it at level 68. To unlock a flight path, travel to the area and speak to a flight master. This allows you to use the unlocked path in future adventures. World of Warcraft has had nine expansions: The Burning Crusade (2007), Wrath of the Lich King (2008), Cataclysm (2010), Mists of Pandaria (2012), Warlords of Draenor (2014), Legion (2016), Battle for Azeroth, and Shadowlands. WoW is free to play up to level 20, but a subscription is needed to access high-level characters. To continue leveling past 50, purchase the expansion Shadowlands. If experience gains are disabled, speak to Behsten in Stormwind or Slatz in Orgrimmar to reactivate them. The max level in WoW without leaving the boat can be achieved through Exile's Reach and is currently at level 70. To get flying mounts, unlock several different types by speaking to a flight master. There are five mounts available: Brooms, Hippogriff, Onyx Hippogrieff, Threstal, and Graphorn. Northrend flying requires level 68 and costs 1000g. Wrath of the Lich King Classic adds new ground and flying mounts. Players can choose whether to spare or kill Regalla for a unique Sharpshot Bow. To unlock first to fly, complete The Wings of the Ten and then head north of Stone Crest to override a Sunwing and fight the Stormbird. In WOW TBC Classic, flying mounts have regular and swift speeds, with default introductory rare quality mounts available. Increased movement speed on both land and in the air has been implemented. Epic quality mounts, such as Swift Blue Gryphon, offer 100% land speed and 280% air speed, but require additional riding skill training beyond flying skills to use effectively. Using Rare flying mounts, which have a 60% speed advantage, is actually less desirable than using Epic ground mounts acquired at level 60. As a result, it's recommended to stick with the ground mount for land travel and only utilize the flying mount when necessary, such as accessing new areas or bypassing windy paths. In contrast to World of Warcraft: Classic, the riding skill gold costs in Burning Crusade classic are significantly higher. Expert Riding and Rare flying mount will cost 900 gold, while reaching maximum speed requires a substantial 5,200 gold investment.
