New Horizon Academy has locations in Colorado, Iowa, Idaho, Kansas, and Minnesota. **Step 2:** Arrange a visit to one of our locations so you can learn about our early learning programs, meet the teachers, and see the curriculum in action. **Step 3:** Complete the electronic enrollment paperwork and required forms sent by your school. Alternatively, parents can apply directly to the school to be added to the waiting list. Admission is based on available spaces, with children admitted after their third birthday. We have limited spots available for our morning (8:30am-11:30am) and afternoon (12pm-3pm) sessions. New intakes occur in September, January, and April. Parents will receive information about the Nursery Teacher and admission arrangements once they receive confirmation of a nursery place. Note that attending the nursery does not guarantee a full-time reception spot. Parents must apply separately to Medway Council for this. Reception is now open to all children after their fourth birthday. In September, we accept 90 pupils (30 per class). If your child is due to start primary school in September 2024, you can appeal if they're not offered a place at one of your preferred schools on National Offer Day (April 16th). Appeals must be submitted before May 14th for consideration by July 16th. Late appeals will be heard within 40 days from the deadline or as soon as possible. At New Horizon Academy, we aim to provide a well-rounded curriculum that caters to the diverse needs of each pupil. Our intention is to ensure that our offerings are broad, balanced, and meet the required standards. We strive to create an environment where pupils can progress at their own pace, with access to various learning opportunities. Our approach involves delivering the curriculum through a combination of structured lessons, hands-on activities, play-based learning, and small group instruction. This careful planning ensures that pupils receive pre-requisites to build upon new knowledge and make progress. We also prioritize support and challenge, striking a balance to accommodate pupils' varying needs. Teachers are trained professionals in their subject area, with the option to be supported by qualified staff or teaching assistants when necessary. Regular training and collaboration among teachers enhance our capacity to engage and support pupils with special educational needs. While our primary focus lies elsewhere, we acknowledge that some of our resources also feature other programs, such as Camp Discovery and SciKids, designed to foster learning through exciting activities and hands-on experiences. New Horizon Academy offers a comprehensive preschool experience that fosters STEAM activities, culinary skills, and community service. Through engaging programs like Kids Cuisine and Caring Beyond the Classroom, children develop important life skills while making a positive impact on their local community. The Summer Book Club helps prevent summer slide, and Outdoor Adventures promote health and well-being through fun games and positive reinforcement. Character Education Curriculum teaches respect, responsibility, and diversity in an inclusive environment, preparing children for critical life-skills. Preschool classrooms are designed to be fun, happy, and engaging, supporting school-readiness skills and social-emotional development. Our preschool program offers a fun and engaging way for children to explore arts, math, and other essential subjects. After a morning of activity, kids can take a nap on their own cot or participate in quiet activities if they're not tired. Our literacy program helps little ones develop reading skills, while music, movement, and playtime keep them active and happy. Our safe playground is perfect for kids to run around and get some exercise. At New Horizon Academy, we provide top-notch early childhood education that prepares kids for kindergarten and beyond. Our curriculum is backed by research and has a proven track record of success - over 90% of our pre-k graduates meet or exceed kindergarten readiness standards! Our experienced teachers create opportunities for kids to learn and grow, teaching them important skills like socialization, problem-solving, and self-confidence. We encourage independence in our preschoolers, allowing them to take on small tasks and make decisions for themselves. Our state-of-the-art classrooms are designed with learning in mind, featuring nine interactive centers that cater to different interests and abilities.
