Especially for something like Japanese grammar where there is less ambiguity, tests can be quite effective. So I decided to try writing a series of tests, hoping they will be of use for my readers. I'm starting small, with a short question 8 test that targets the foundations of basic Japanese particles (or は ?? Besides that the only thing you have to be familiar with is hiragana and katakana. Don't worry about Kanji - I gave readings for all Kanji used in questions. Taking the test is simple and no registration is required, all you have to do is choose a username. Ideally you would use this through all tests so that the results could be tracked as a drive. Although your is an advanced Japanese apprentice, please take the test as it will help me to assess how much interest there is for theseof testing. If things go well, I will end up doing these for all types of topics, including more advanced material and more involved tests (more than a simple multiple choice).
