But they're quite easy to remember once you get the hang of it, and there aren't any barre chords to struggle with either. However, if you want to imitate the great Iz, then you'll need to get a bit more technical. Start by plucking the low G string at the first bar, rather than strumming the whole chord. Then move on to a pattern of down-down-up-up-down (DDUUD). Iz uses a lot of dynamics in his strumming, so you'll have to listen closely to how he does it if you really want to nail his playing style. Table of ContentsThe Chords You'll NeedStrumming PatternThe Song The Chords You'll Need Rather fittingly, there are seven ukulele chords you'll need for this song (the same as the number of colors in a rainbow). Whether that was intentional or not, who knows, but the good news is they're all fairly basic chords which is another reason why Somewhere Over the Rainbow is a great song for beginners. Another bonus is there are no tricky barre chords to get your hands around. There are four major ukulele chords: C, D, F, G. Two minors: Em, Am. Two sevenths: Dm7, E7. Strumming Pattern Before we get to the song, let's quickly look at the strumming pattern. Of course, it will take a while before you get to sound anything like the great Israel Kamakawiwo'ole who uses a lot of dynamics in his strumming. The best strumming pattern involves plucking the G string on the first beat of every bar, followed by a down-up, up-down-up. It's pretty much what Israel Kamakawiwo'ole plays - although he's got his G string tuned to low G (not the typical high G), but it works fine with either tuning. If you're struggling with the above, just go with a simple DUDUDUDU pattern. The Song Ok, enough talking! Here's the song. Enjoy.
