You also need to complete a 6-hour behind-the-wheel driving course if you're under 17. Finally, pay the required fees. In New Jersey, the cost to acquire a basic driver's license is \$24. The fee includes the cost of the initial permit, as well as the license itself. However, there may be additional costs for driver's education courses, practice tests, and other related expenses. Please note that fees are subject to change and it's best to check the latest information on the NJ MVC website. In New Jersey, the minimum age to obtain a learner's permit is 16 years old.
