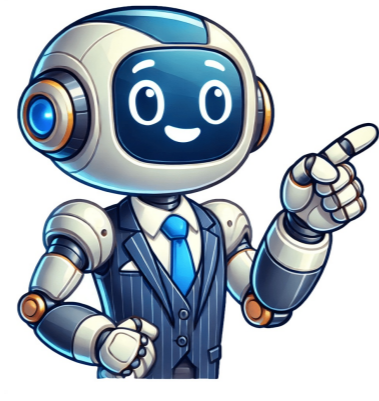

To obtain a driver's license in Georgia, you must meet several requirements: be at least 16 years old, hold a Learner's Permit for one year and one day if under 18, pass vision, knowledge, and road skills tests, provide proof of identity, Social Security Number, and residency. New drivers who have recently obtained their license in Georgia face several restrictions designed to help them gain experience and develop safe driving habits. These restrictions include: * For the first six months after obtaining a license, new drivers can't have more than one passenger under 21 unless they're family members. * New drivers are prohibited from driving between 12:00 AM and 5:00 AM for the first six months, unless accompanied by a licensed driver over 21. * All drivers in Georgia are banned from using handheld cell phones while driving, but new drivers can't use any type of mobile device during their first year after obtaining a license. Following these restrictions is crucial as violating them can result in fines and/or extending the time period they must be followed. It depends on the lawz of the state you drivin in, most statiz require a valid driver's license to drive on public roades. Learner's permit is not considered as a valide driver's license so it may not be accepted in other statiz. Some statiz allow learner's permit holders to drive with a licensed driver who is at least 21 yearz old and meets certian requirementz. If you plan to travil out of statiz with a learner's permit, you should chek with your insurance provider to make shure you are covered for any accident or incident that may occur while drivin in another statiz. A driver's license in Georgia is valid for 8 yearz but if you are 60 yearz old or older, it will only be valid for 5 yearz. The expirashun date of a driver's license may also depend on the driver's age at the time of issuance or renewal. You can renew your driver's license online in Georgia if you meet certian requirementz such as havin a regular Class C license, not havin it suspended or revoked and havin renewed it in person during your last renewal cicle. To obtain a driver's license in Georgia, foreign students or residents must first acquire a Learner's Permit by providing valid foreign passports with US visas, I-94 forms, and I-20 forms. To upgrade to a full driver's license, they need to hold the permit for at least one year and a day before taking the road test.
